AFFIDAVIT

I, Victor Bourque, of the City of Moncton in the Province of New Brunswick,
MAKE OATH AND SAY THAT:

1. I am the father of the accused and am making this affidavit in support of Justin having an assessment under s. 672.11 C.C.C.
2. I have met with David M. Lutz, Q.C., who is representing Justin on the above captioned charge, and have explained to Mr. Lutz why I believe the assessment is necessary.
3. Up until approximately 18 months ago, I did not see any serious mental or emotional problem with Justin.
4. Up until December 10, 2012, Justin lived in the family home with his mother and me and his six siblings. We were a very close-knit family until Justin was asked by his mother and me to leave the home. His inappropriate behaviour and his purchase of yet another gun prompted our request.
5. Since that time I noticed him entering into serious depression, emotional and financial instability which got worse by the month. I noticed this when Justin came home to visit or eat. Often, he would pace back and forth while talking about things that made no sense to me or other members of the family.
6. In the preceding month before this incident, I noticed that Justin's emotional and mental state was deteriorating even further.

7. Approximately two days before the incident, I was unable to calm Justin down while driving him to work.. He was ranting and raging against all authority and concerning himself with matters which were well beyond his control and some issues not even relating to Canada. This behaviour I can only describe as paranoia.
8. I was unable to reason with him in any manner whatsoever.
9. On the afternoon of the incident I was with him again and he had told me he was going to work. This was around 5:00 p.m. Later, I learned from a telephone call from his place of employment that he did not show up for work. I called him to ask why he lied to me – he was distant and disrespectful to me on the telephone. He hung up on me. He had never spoken to me in this fashion before. His tone was very dry and as if it was another person speaking.
10. I am prepared to testify before the Court if the Court finds it necessary.
